As the cold weather season approaches, and the Mission continues to provide safe shelter for the homeless and hot nutritional meals for the hungry, God also calls us to use His continued provision to provide various outreaches to those outside our walls.

One such provision this past year is God opening the door to expand our street outreach to help address the issue of unsheltered individuals living on the streets. Jesus instructed us in Matthew 25:35 stating "for I was hungry and you gave Me food; I was thirsty and you gave Me drink; I was a stranger and

you took Me in." The street outreach team follows this scripture daily, going into the streets and offering unsheltered guests food, drink and hygiene products all while encouraging them to come inside to receive further assistance. They work with our local police to locate the unsheltered as well as reduce the amount of panhandling taking place in the area. They are a bright beacon of light for those lost on our streets as well as our community.

Throughout the year, the Mission's Family Care Ministry also provides various outreaches as it works to meet the needs of families with grocery assistance, a lifeline for many who might otherwise go hungry. The ministry also provided kids with supplies needed to go back to school once again this year. Now, upon entering the last two months of the year, Family Care enters its busiest and most critical season. During November, the Thanksgiving Basket Outreach will provide hundreds of families with everything they need for a special

holiday meal. Thanksgiving turkeys and baskets of stuffing, vegetables, and all the trimmings are provided, allowing families to gather around the table and give thanks despite difficult circumstances. In December, the Mission's annual Christmas Gift Assistance will provide families the opportunity to choose toys, clothing, and other gifts for their children, who might otherwise wake up to an empty tree on Christmas morning. The love and compassion of Jesus will be on display, as our Mission family helps other families celebrate Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Outreach is one more way that City Rescue Mission displays God's love to His children. We praise God for these opportunities to serve others. We also recognize none of this would be possible without the blessings the Lord so abundantly provides - volunteers with hearts ready to serve and donors with hearts ready to give, working alongside our dedicated staff. To God give the praise and glory!

Faith and Family The Antidote for When You're at Odds

Studies show that gratitude has a positive effect on our mental and physical well-being. That's good news as we head into a season focused on getting together and giving thanks.

But we know that family gatherings can sometimes mean families disagreeing. Practicing gratitude together is the antidote for hard feelings and harsh words. Here are some ideas:

Remember God's goodness. Recall shared stories and memories, ways God has shown His faithfulness, and answers to prayer.

Make your gratitude active. Set extra places at your Thanksgiving table and invite college students who can't make it home for the holiday. Bless neighbors with a meal. Volunteer at a local rescue mission.

Think forward. Leaving a gift in your will or estate plan to the City Rescue Mission is a lasting expression of gratitude to God. The holidays provide a wonderful opportunity to share this with your family, reflect together on His blessings, and move forward in unity.
