As you read about the completion of our new Advantage Stay Program Dormitory, it is just another example of God's greater plan. God aligned the funding, the contractors, the resources and space to make it all happen over a one-year span. We continue to see the puzzle assembled by God as we collaborate with local manufacturers to help our men obtain employment through our Job Readiness Program, a model that is working so well that we will be presenting the plan to other gospel rescue missions from across the nation at the Citygate Network Annual Conference in May 2025. Our Community Bridges initiative, a collaboration of agencies designed to support the development of meaningful connections among guests of the Mission and the broader community, is another great example since its inception in late 2022. What started with biweekly visits from a mobile medical unit grew into expanding our street outreach, to the formation of a county homeless taskforce, and most recently the formation of a taskforce with the City of New Castle to focus on joint street outreach starting in the spring of 2025. What an amazing example that we need to continue to trust God's process as he built those connections over the years.

One of the greatest challenges in waiting on God's timing to arrive is the temptation to rush ahead of His timing. However, trusting divine timing requires surrendering control and believing that God knows what is best. Patience and faith are vital in the process. Waiting for God to align things can be challenging, but it is also an opportunity to grow in faith, patience, and trust. Rest assured that when the time is right, everything will come together in ways that exceed our expectations.

At the City Rescue Mission, we once again witnessed God's perfect timing with the renovation of our new Advantage Stay Program dormitory this past November. The Advantage Stay Program is an extended stay program for those men sheltering at the Mission who have employment, with the intention to not only help them save up money to move into independent living, but also receive training, instruction and mentorship through our Job Readiness Program to sustain such employment long-term.



Thanks to a generous grant from the Ellwood City Community Health Foundation, the project was completed right when it was most needed as it provided an additional twelve beds just in time for the cold winter months. This experience reaffirmed that God's hand is in every detail, guiding and providing.

God's timing not only blessed the project's completion but also expanded our ability to serve. The new dormitory also opened up twelve beds in our Crossroads Emergency Shelter, which previously also sheltered our Advantage Stay Program men, allowing us to provide shelter to more homeless men, meeting a growing need in our community. Our Crossroads Emergency Shelter offers a safe, Godly place for men to receive temporary shelter from the streets, access to three hot meals a day and the opportunity to hear of the hope found in a personal relationship with Jesus

Christ. As temperatures dropped to dangerously cold levels during January, more men now had the opportunity to come in off the streets and find a safe and warm place to sleep. This tangible expression of God's provision continues to inspire us to trust in His perfect plan.

We are grateful for God's perfect timing here at the City Rescue Mission. We are also thankful to those who continue to support us not only through financial gifts or through volunteering their time, but who are prayer warriors praying for God's continued provisions. We thank God for providing the tools needed to serve and trust He will continue to do so into the future with perfect timing. As we navigate the call to serve, may we rest in the assurance that God's timing is flawless. His plans are good, His love is unchanging, and His timing -though often mysterious- is always perfect.

# Faith and Family Expanding Your Family Circle

Social worker Alan Naiman worked with families in crisis, served as a foster parent, and was the main caregiver for his developmentally disabled brother. When he died in 2018, Alan left \$11 million to charities that directly meet children's needs.\*

Music teacher Jane Kesson left a gift in her will to the Philadelphia Orchestra, an organization she supported for many years. They use that gift to fund teacher workshops and concerts for schoolchildren in honor of Jane.\*\*

Neither Alan nor Jane ever married or had children of their own, which affected the way they approached their estate plans. Without spouses or heirs, they expanded the definition of family to include causes that were important to them—and left legacies that are impacting many beyond their lifetimes.

Married or single, parent or not, you can leave a lasting inheritance through a simple concept known as "Child Called Charity"—adding a ministry you're deeply connected with to your estate plan as one of your heirs. Expand your family circle to make a difference for years to come.


